

2014/15 Sports Premium

The government has announced that it is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum from academic years 2013 to 2020, to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. This funding - provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport - will be allocated to primary school head teachers. The money must be used to improve the provision of P.E. and school sport.

St Helena's has always had a strong tradition of excellence in sport and P.E. We believe that P.E. and school sport contribute to the whole development of our children and through participation, in a diverse range of activities, our children build and learn more about our key values.

St Helena's will receive a lump sum of £8000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil per annum. The funding must be spent on Physical Education and Games and will be surveyed by Ofsted at the end of the academic year.

Expenditure:

- £4500 - St Helena's Primary School has bought in to the Sports Partnership created by the Greenwood Dale Foundation Trust and delivered through the Skegness Academy. This partnership provides specialist teaching for pupils and CPD for the whole staff team, through observing sport sessions within our Academy, and bespoke training to meet the needs of our pupils. We are also full members of the Youth Sport Trust, enabling our staff to access valuable training at Key Stage 1 and 2 and also have a clear understanding regarding the national landscape for PE/Sport
- £700 Specialist Gymnastics coach
- £272 PE Manuals to support the planning and differentiation of PE

- £160 Five minutes a day - active start to learning
- £515 Transport to sporting events
- £102.97 Enhancing PE sports equipment within the Academy
- £934 Allowing CPD opportunities
- £170 Trophies and Medals to celebrate sporting achievement
- £70 Quick-sticks Hockey competition entry
- £11.00 caps for reception at sports day
- £1500 range of specialist sporting equipment during a sports themed week for the whole school. This gave children opportunities to take part in a range of healthy and adventurous activities.

Use and impact:

Over the first years of the sports premium, we are delighted to have been able to support the development of P.E. and school sport in the following ways:

- To increase participation levels in competitive sport and healthy activity of pupils.
- School understands and values the benefits of high quality PE and sport, including its use as tool for whole school improvement
- Provide quality assured professional development opportunities for teachers, enabling quality teaching and learning for all children
- Fund new sports equipment to aid the delivery of a range of sports
- Provide a wide range of after-school sports clubs

During 2015/16 our overall aim remains the same, to raise standards in P.E. and school sport, increasing the participation and opportunities offered to our children. We aim to provide higher quality lessons and improved learning for all.

Through PE audits, we have identified the need for a more detailed long-term framework to aid and support all teachers in the delivery of PE across the PE curriculum. This academic year we are also altering

the delivery of PE, allowing sports specialist to have more time with children to further enhance their skills in a range of sporting activities. Due to this, we have been able to offer children opportunities in Dance, Gymnastics, Hockey, Basketball, Badminton, Tri-Golf, Netball, Football, Volleyball and Tag-Rugby during the autumn and spring terms.

The additional funding has allowed for the continued use of specialist PE teachers, from Skegness Academy, to deliver high quality PE to KS2. This has allowed for smaller groups during PE time, enabling all children to reach their full potential in a safe and stimulating environment. While specialist sports teachers raise the standards in KS2, the funding has allowed for our specialist PE teacher to be released from class to provide KS1 with high intensity engaging activity.
