Pupil Premium Spending 2013/14

We endeavour to support all our children academically, socially, emotionally and physically. We do this by providing the best quality teaching, carefully matched interventions, resources and learning spaces that we can. This is evaluated regularly by staff and governors through lesson observations, work scrutinies and pupil progress meetings. As always, we focus on what is working well and what needs to improve to ensure all children make good progress throughout the year.

Measuring the impact of Pupil Premium spending 2011/12/13

By May 2012 our children in receipt of Pupil Premium had made:

- Expected or better progress across all areas of the EYFS Profile in the Foundation Stage
- Good progress in Reading and Mathematics and satisfactory progress in Writing in Key Stage 1
- Excellent progress in Reading and satisfactory progress in Writing and Mathematics across Key Stage 2
- 100% of Y6 made 2 levels progress in Reading and Mathematics

By May 2013 our children in receipt of Pupil Premium had made:

- Good progress in Reading, Writing and Mathematics in Key Stage 1
- Good progress in Reading and Writing and satisfactory in Mathematics across Key Stage 2
- 100% of Y6 made 2 levels progress in Reading and Mathematics
- (There were no Pupil Premium children in the Foundation Stage in 2012/13)

The nature of support 2013/14

Pupil Premium amounts to £21600 this year.

| Amount | Purpose |

| £2930 | To provide small group tuition 1:3 with a teacher |
| £15170 | To decrease the teacher:pupil ratio to 1:16 in Lower Key Stage 2 from September 2013 |
| £2600 | To facilitate subsidised places for Pupil Premium children: At Breakfast Club and the after school Home Learning Hub, On Educational Visits |
| £680 | To provide a daily Nurture group "Smiley Club" to support vulnerable children at the beginning of each day |
| £220 | To fund external support agencies to work with families |
