Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 Relationships and Sex Education.

During the last two weeks of half term (Monday 17th to Friday 28th May), the children in Year 3/4, Year 4/5 and Year 6 will be exploring Relationships and Sex Education as part of their Science and PSHE learning. All of the content to be delivered is in line with the Science curriculum, and the new 2020/21 PSHE/RSE framework for primary schools.

Over the course of a number of sessions, the children explore:

- Puberty, hygiene and human development.
- Sexual intercourse and human reproduction.
- Love and relationships.

Year 6 Children will consider:

- The differences between sex, gender and sexuality.
- Sex in the media.

Sunnyside garden is much happier now that we have had some rain during the week. The water butts which were only half full have quickly refilled and the plants in the garden are growing more quickly, especially the onions.

The Reception class planted two ammi plants when they visited last week. These will become very tall and have lovely white flowers. They were 30 and 45 cms tall, so we will measure them regularly to see how quickly they grow. I have had to find a stick to support the taller plant and will tie it to the stick so that it grows up straight.

The potatoes had started to produce green shoots, so I have earthed up the soil over the new leaves. This should protect the plants when we have a cold, frosty night.

Have you seen the trees getting their new leaves? I love to see the hedgerows looking green with their new blossom. Have a look around you as you travel to school.
