Sunnyside Garden

I like to grow lots of flowers in the garden. This week I have taken photos of some of my pots and one of the baskets. These have been very pretty during summer, but I have to water them well, especially the baskets.

I arrange a row of pots full of geraniums which always gives a splash of bright red colour to the garden. There are 5 plants in each pot which have grown well and are at their best in September. They will not like it as the weather gets cooler, so I will then put the plants on the compost heat and plant bulbs and pansies into the pots.

The begonias are very colourful and as they die down, the stems, leaves and flowers are also composted, but the large corms that are under the soil are dried, wrapped in newspaper and stored in the garage until they can be replanted next year.

I love the flowering plant that has flowers that look like pineapples. This originally came from Mrs Seymour's garden. As it dies down, I will put the pot in the greenhouse for the winter months and repot it next spring. I started with 3 plants several years ago and now I have 12. Thank you Mrs Seymour.

I have three hanging baskets full of plants which need daily watering. Unfortunately some of the winds we had recently have caused the plants to wilt and they will soon need to be emptied to the compost heap. Then I will have to decide whether to replant them for the autumn and which plants would be suitable. I may need to visit a local nursery and ask for some advice.


